3. All correspondence between LASA (and/or by any past LASA officer) and the LPC regarding the revival of the complaint for re-investigation by the LPC.
4. All 'Reports submitted by the Complaints Committee of the Society of Advocates', considered by the LPC at its meeting on 7 March 2020, mentioned in the letter.
5. The minutes of all and any resolutions passed by the Society in regard to the disposal of the complaint, considered by the LPC at its 7 March 2020 meeting.
6. All and any other documents considered by the LPC at its 7 March 2020 meeting before resolving 'to commence with investigations into this matter de nova [*sic*] – the 'matter' being LASA's complaint to the Society against me in November 2015.
