Dear Mrs Schafer,

Thank you very much for your email letter of 12 September acknowledging receipt of my letter to the Auditor-General of 1 August which has not yet been acknowledged by his office. I very much appreciate your time in responding as I understand that MPs have a great many commitments.

I would like to correct two misperceptions of your letter. Firstly, all of LASA's paperwork in relation to their defence to Adv.Brink's claim is available at [www.tig.org.za/LASA](http://www.tig.org.za/LASA), username lasa, password LASA2010, except the critical records they are concealing by unlawfully refusing to comply with PAIA. Secondly, Brink was the only recommended candidate for the Pietermaritzburg Senior Litigator post. The Durban internal candidate was informed 3 months before Brink that the Durban post was not being filled.

After going to extraordinary lengths to avoid litigation Brink had no alternative other than to seek justice under the constitution in the courts and clearly neither MPs nor ordinary citizens can interfere in court processes.

The issues of corporate governance, internal control, public accountability and executive management bonuses which were the subject of my letter to the AG are separate from the justice and constitutional rights that Brink is now claiming in the courts. As you carry out your representative responsibilities at your Portfolio Committee meeting with LASA on tuesday, I will be thinking a great deal of the extraordinary courage of my late mother in seeking justice and human rights for all citizens from the late 1950s.
